From Board of Public Works

Moved by Mr. Rentschler, supported by Mr. Menefee, that the Board of Public Works call to the attention of the Common Council the fact that Ernest Wurster is the owner of the building located at 213-215-217 N. 4th Ave. That Mr. Wurster is now remodeling said building and the front line of the building as shown by the work already done is, in places, two feet out in the street. Mr. Wurster has been notified by the Board of Public Works to bring the proposed new front of his building out of the street. This he has refused to do and is proceeding with the work. Wherefore the Board respectfully asks the Council to take action.

Whereas, it has come to the attention of the Common Council of the City of Ann Arbor that Ernest M. Wurster, a resident of said city, in rebuilding the store building owned by him at 213-215-217 North Fourth Avenue in this city, is rebuilding the fronts and walls of said building in places two feet out

in the street and beyond his property line as shown by resolution of the Board of Public Works, and the Mayor and City Clerk having already taken legal action to stop said rebuilding, through proceedings in the Circuit Court of Washtenaw County by and through the City Attorney.

Therefore, be it resolved, that the legal action so taken be and the same is hereby ratified and confirmed in every particular, and, be it further resolved, that the Mayor and City Clerk shall be and are hereby given full authority to take any action in connection with said rebuilding which shall be deemed desirable by way of legal proceedings to protect the interests of said city.

City Attorney made oral report that bill of complaint had been filed and temporary injunction served.
