Mr. Wurster has been notified by the Board of Public Works to bring the proposed new front of his building out of the street. This he has refused to do and is proceeding with the work. Wherefore the Board respectfully asks the Council to take action.

Whereas, it has come to the attention of the Common Council of the City of Ann Arbor that Ernest M. Wurster, a resident of said city, in rebuilding the store building owned by him at 213-215-217 North Fourth Avenue in this city, is rebuilding the fronts and walls of said building in places two feet out

in the street and beyond his property line as shown by resolution of the Board of Public Works, and the Mayor and City Clerk having already taken legal action to stop said rebuilding, through proceedings in the Circuit Court of Washtenaw County by and through the City Attorney.

Therefore, be it resolved, that the legal action so taken be and the same is hereby ratified and confirmed in every particular, and, be it further resolved, that the Mayor and City Clerk shall be and are hereby given full authority to take any action in connection with said rebuilding which shall be deemed desirable by way of legal proceedings to protect the interests of said city.

Poor and Cemetery Committee Report

To the Honorable, the Common Council:

Gentlemen—We respectfully recommend:

1. That all persons desiring to bury relatives or friends in Fairview Cemetery must make application at the office of the City Clerk for a burial permit, such application to be accompanied by fees as follows: For an adult, or child twelve years of age or over, ten dollars; for a child from the age of five years to twelve, seven dollars; for a child under five years age, four dollars; if steel or cement box is used, three dollars additional fee; for burial during the period from December 1 to April 1 inclusive, an additional fee of two dollars; for burial on Sunday, an additional fee of five dollars. Fee for burial shall include digging and filling the grave but does not include the burial space.

2. That the following charges shall be paid at the office of the City Clerk for use of the receiving vault: Two dollars for first fifteen days and twenty-five cents per week thereafter for each person; provided, that if burial space has been purchased in Fairview Cemetery for said person and burial is made in said cemetery, there shall be no charge for use of receiving vault.

3. That the City Engineer prepare a plat of the road as shown on the plat between blocks 19 and 20 (old part) for the purpose of single interments, and the price per burial space in said plat is hereby fixed at twenty-five dollars and shall include perpetual care of grave.

4. That the agreement of Elmer Wisner made with the City for the purchase of buildings at 1303 Wright Street for the sum of one hundred five dollars, said buildings

to be removed within thirty days from date of purchase, be referred to the City Attorney with power to notify Mr. Wisner that he has not conformed with contract and, in the event he does not comply therewith, to cause said buildings to be removed.
