Fifth Ave., between the Municipal Garage and the Unity Block, also owned by the city, for which a rental of \$15.00 per month received. The Health Officer tells me this place is a menace to health (it has no toilet facilities); the Fire Chief says it is a fire hazard and the Engineer informs me that the upkeep cost absorbs most of the rent received. This "shack" is not a credit to our city. I would therefore recommend that the building be removed and the lot made into a temporary playground for the children of the neighborhood.
