Resolution Ordering Pavement Bond

By Ald. Slauson.

Whereas, this Common Council has authorized the construction by the Board of Public Works of pavements in pavement districts Nos. 97 to 104 inclusive, and this Common Council having caused to be certified to the City Assessor the lands, tenements and premises to be assessed for the cost of said public improvements and the amounts required to be levied, spread and assessed on and upon each and every of the regular annual assessment rolls of the City of Ann Arbor, therefore be it

Resolved, and it is hereby ordered that the Mayor and City Clerk are hereby authorized and required to sign and countersign respectively and execute under their hands and the seal of the City of Ann Arbor pavement bonds of the City of Ann Arbor under date of March 18, 1929, as follows:

For District No. 97, the sum of \$8,400.00; For district No. 98, the sum of \$4,800.00; for District No. 99, the sum of \$4,300.00; for District No. 100, the sum of \$4,500; for District No. 101, the sum of \$6,000.00; for District No. 102, the sum of \$3,000.00; for District No. 103, the sum of \$3,500.00; for District No. 104, the sum of \$2,500.00; that being less than the total cost of said respective public improvements, said bonds payable to bear-

er in ten equal annual installments from and after the first day of August, 1928, with interest at the rate of four and one-half per cent per annum, payable annually on the first day of August in each and every year, as evidenced by interest coupons to be thereto attached, bearing the printed or lithographed signatures of the Mayor and City Clerk of the City of Ann Arbor, principal and interest to be payable at the office of the City Treasurer, Ann Arbor, Michigan.

Resolved, further, that the Mayor and City Clerk are hereby directed to deliver said bonds, when executed, to the City Treasurer, who is authorized to sell said bonds at private sale at not less than par and accrued interest, and said bonds and coupons shall be substantially in the form for pavement bonds adopted by this Common Council July 18, 1927.

Resolved, further, that the estimated period of usefulness of said pavements is hereby determined to be fifteen years and upwards.

Resolution Ordering Curb and Gutter Bond

Whereas, this Common Council has authorized the construction by the Board of Public Works of curbs and gutters in curb and gutter districts Nos. 136, 137, 142 to 156 inclusive, and this Common Council having caused to be certified to the City Assessor the lands, tenements and premises to be assessed for the cost of said public improvements and the amounts required to be levied, spread and assessed on and upon each and every of the regular annual assessments rolls of the City of Ann Arbor, therefore be it

Resolved, and it is hereby ordered that the Mayor and City Clerk are hereby authorized and required to sign and countersign respectively and execute under their hands and the seal of the City of Ann Arbor curb and gutter bonds of the City of Ann Arbor under date of March 18, 1929, as follows:

For District No. 136, the sum of \$5,000.00; for District No. 137, the sum of \$1,800.00; for District No. 142, the sum of \$1,400.00; for District No. 143, the sum of \$600.00; for District No. 144, the sum of \$1,200.00; for District No. 145, the sum of \$2,400.00; for District No. 146, the sum of \$2,600.00; for District No. 147, the sum of \$1,600.00; for District No. 148, the sum of \$1,200.00; for District No. 149, the sum of \$1,200.00; for District No. 150, the sum of \$1,000.00; for District No. 151, the sum of \$3,200.00; for District No. 152, the sum of \$2,800.00; for District No. 153, the sum of \$2,000.00; for District No. 154, the sum of \$1,200.00; for District No. 155, the sum of \$1,000.00; for District No. 156, the sum of \$1,200.00; that being less than the total cost of said respective public improvements, said bonds payable to bearer in four equal annual installments from and after the first day of August, 1928, with interest at the rate of four and one-half per cent per annum, payable annually on the first day of August in each and every year, as evidenced by interest coupons to be thereto attached, bearing the printed or lithographed signatures of the Mayor and City Clerk of the City of Ann Arbor, principal and interest to be payable at the office of the City Treasurer, Ann Arbor, Michigan.

Resolved, further, that the Mayor and City Clerk are hereby directed to deliver said bonds, when executed, to the City Treasurer, who is hereby authorized to sell said bonds at private sale at not less than par and accrued interest, and said bonds and coupons

shall be substantially in the form for curb and gutter bonds.

Resolved, further, that the estimated period of usefulness of said curbs and gutters is hereby determined to be fifteen years and upwards.

Resolution Ordering Lateral Sewer Bonds

Whereas, this Common Council has authorized the construction by the Board of Public Works of lateral sewers in lateral sewer districts Nos. 175, 176, and 177, and this Common Council having caused to be certified to the City Assessor the lands, tenements and premises to be assessed for the cost of said public improvements and the amounts required to be levied, spread and assessed on and upon each and every of the regular annual assessment rolls of the City of Ann Arbor, therefore be it

Resolved, and it is hereby ordered that the Mayor and City Clerk are hereby authorized and required to sign and countersign respectively and execute under their hands and the seal of the City of Ann Arbor lateral sewer bonds of the City of Ann Arbor under date of March 18, 1929, as follows:

For Districts No. 175, the sum of \$9,600.00; for District No. 176, the sum of \$2,000.00; for District No. 177, the sum of \$3,000.00; that being less than the total cost of said respective public improvements, said bonds payable to bearer in four equal annual installments beginning August 1, 1929, with interest at the rate of four and one-half per cent per annum, payable annually on the first day of August in each and every year, as evidenced by interest coupons to be thereto attached, principal

and interest to be payable at the office of the City Treasurer, Ann Arbor, Michigan.

Resolved, further that the Mayor and City Clerk are hereby directed to deliver said bonds, when executed, to the City Treasurer, who is authorized to sell said bonds at private sale at not less than par and accrued interest, and said bonds and coupons shall be substantially in the form for lateral sewer bonds adopted by this Common Council August 2, 1926.

Resolved, further, that the estimated period of usefulness of said later sewers is hereby determined to be fifteen years and upwards.

Adopted by following vote: Yeas, Ald. Slauson, Wuerth, Maulbetsch, Allmendinger, Harris, Bradley, Kurth, Bursley, Pres. Woodbury, 9. Nays, none.
