ORDINANCE COMMITTEE

Ald. Severance gave notice that at the next meeting of the Common Council he would offer a resolution to amend Rule 16 to allow the passage of the proposed Building Code of the City of Ann Arbor by the reading thereof by title only.

Ald. Severance presented an ordinance to regulate electric wiring and the use of electricity, also two communications, and moved that matter be left in the hands of the Ordinance Committee.

Action was deferred.

Ald. Severance reported that the Ordinance Committee recommended following changes to the Zoning Ordinance:

1. The property of Bonisteel and

Loveland, which was voted into the city at April election be placed in class "A" residence district.

2. The land embraced in the plat of William Osius be placed in class "A" residence district.

3. To change from class "A" and "B" to class "C" part of lots one and two, block five south, range five east, be denied.

4. To change from Class "B" to class "C" all of the northwest 40 feet of lot 15 of White Addition, be denied.

5. To change the property on the east side of North Fifth avenue, Catherine street north 132 feet be denied.

6. To change part of lot number 10 of Miller's Addition, be denied.

7. To change the south half of block bounded by Division, Huron, State and Washington streets from class "B" to "C" be denied.

8. That all of the 400 block bounded by Division, Washington, and Huron streets be changed from class "B" to class "C."

Moved by Ald. Severance that recommendations of Ordinance Committee be concurred in.

Amendment—Moved by Ald. Severance that action be deferred and that we hold a meeting of the Committee of the Whole.
