6, 1929, ordering pavement on Lincoln Avenue as District No. 112 be corrected to read District No. 110, account of Lawrence and Catherine Streets not being ordered built this year.

By Ald. Wuerth:

Whereas, this Common Council has been applied to in writing by a majority of the owners of the lands, which are liable to be assessed for the payment of the construction of the same, praying for the curbing and guttering of the following curb and gutter districts: District No. 171, on Haven Avenue between Monroe Street and Hill Street; District No. 172, on Gardner Avenue between Packard St. and Westminster Place; District No. 173, on Montclair Place, between Gardner Avenue and south end; District No. 174, on S. Division Street between Hill Street and Hoover Avenue; District No. 175, on Linwood Avenue between Doty Avenue and Wildwood Avenue; within the corporate limits of the City of Ann Arbor, Michigan; and

Whereas, the curbing and guttering of the above named districts within the limits aforesaid, is deemed and declared to be necessary public improvements, therefore be it

Resolved, that it is hereby declared to be the purpose of the Common Council to cause the above named districts, within the limits aforesaid, to be curbed and guttered under the charter and ordinances of the City of Ann Arbor and in pursuance of the prayers of said petitioners.

Resolved, further, that the costs and expense of the construction of said public improvements shall be charged, assessed and paid as follows: All street and public alley intersections and twenty per cent

of the remaining shall be paid by the city and the remainder shall be assessed and paid by special assessment, levied and assessed according to benefits on and against all the lands, tenements and premises lying on or fronting the above named districts within the limits aforesaid.
