J. & C. so that the street may be put in a proper condition.

1. That the plans, specifications, and preliminary estimate of cost of proposed storm sewer on Abbott Avenue and Orchard Street, as approved by the Board of Public Works August 21, 1929, be approved; and said Board be instructed to advertise for bids for the construction of said storm sewer.

2. That the construction of the above mentioned storm sewer is hereby deemed and declared to be necessary public improvements.
