**Regular meeting.**

Called to order by the city clerk, President Watts being absent.

Roll called. Quorum present.

Absent—Ald. Wagner and President Watts—2.

On motion of Ald. Manly, Ald. Prettyman was chosen president pro tem.

The journal of the last session was approved.

**PETITIONS AND COMMUNICATIONS.**

A petition signed by 120 residents and property owners, residing along and owning property on Packard and Main streets, remonstrating against granting the petition of the Ann Arbor & Ypsilanti Street Railway Co., for permission to run their steam motors through said streets.

Ald. Manly moved that the petition be received and placed on file.

Adopted.

A claim of Mrs. Ann J. Walker, of the city of Ann Arbor, setting forth that on the evening of October 7th, 1893, she sustained a very severe injury to her right limb, by a fall from the east end of the walk of James Ottley's lot. The petition asked that the sum of \$500 be allowed her for said injury.

Ald. Kitson moved that the petition be accepted and referred to the Board of Public Works and city attorney.

Ald. Martin moved as an amendment that the finance committee be added to said committee.

Which amendment was lost as follows:

The original motion as amended prevailed.
