Rule 19. In line 3 from top of page after "ordered" insert "by two-thirds of the members present."

Rule 17. So amended as to read as follows: The following standing committees shall be appointed, the first named member of any committee to be chairman thereof to-wit:

2. Ordinance.
3. Sewer.
4. Street.
5. Sidewalks.

Rule 20. In the last line after "of" insert "two thirds of". Strike out "elect of the council" and insert "present".

Rule 21. Strike out all after "month."

Rule 24. Strike out "Waple's Handbook of Parliamentary Practice" and insert "Robert's Rules of Order."
