On the 9th. day of April, 1896, the Council passed a resolution directing you to draw an order on the Treasurer for \$4500.00 to purchase a part of lot one, block one, south of Huron-st. range 5 east from the Lucy W. S. Morgan Est., whenever I should examine the title and report the same to be free and clear.

I have made a carefull examination of an abstract of the property, and find that Mrs. Morgan obtained title from one, John M. Case, to the property in question, on the 23rd. Jay of May, 1845 and it has remained in her name from that time to the present time, a period of 51 years.

Some time, on or about May 12th., 1896, one, Lucy C. Eames obtained an injunction from the curcuit court in Chancery of the County of Kalamazoo, forbidding Otis C. Johnson, surviving executor and trustee of the estate of the said Lucy W. S. Morgan, deceased, among other things, from transferring the property in question. On the 21st. day of May, 1896 the Honorable Geo. M. Buck, circuit Judge of said court issued an order modifying said injunction permitting said Otis C.
