Gentlemen: Persuant to your resolution passed at the last regular meeting directing me to secure options on the lands of Lennon, Rhodes and Weeks in the fifth ward for the purpose of a park, I beg leave to report that I understand that a right of way may be obtained from Wall street running north easterly along the Huron river across the lands of George Rhodes for five hundred dollars including the island in the river near the north east end of said way; that a continuation of that right of way may be secured across the lands of George Weeks for the sum of one hundred dollars; that all of the lands owned by S. D. Lennon lying between Cedar Bend Avenue and the Huron River comprising some fifteen acres may be obtained for the purpose aforesaid for the sum of one thousand dollars, provided the city will agree to maintain the fences, and also provided the deed contains certain restrictions concerning the peaceful and orderly regulation of the park.

If any further steps are to be taken concerning this matter, I would recommend that the City Engineer be directed to prepare a plat of the ground and a description thereof, to be submitted to this council at its next regular meet-

ing.
