REPORT OF BOARD OF HEALTH.

Ann Arbor, Mich., Jan. 16, 1899

To the Honorable Mayor, and members of the Common Council:

Gentlemen:-Your Board of Health begs leave to report for the month of December, as follows:

Two inspections have been made and all nuisances thus inspected abated.

Three regular meetings have been levied on and assessed against the held at which all members have been lands, tenements and premises situate

present.

The health of the city for the year ending Dec. 31st, 1898, has been very good taking into account that we have such an influx of students each year from all parts of the country.

We have had 190 deaths this year, 21 of which occurred at the Hospitals, thus bringing our death rate down to 10 per 1000, taking into account that we have 3000 students at least 8 months of the year.

Whereas, this Council having heretofore ordered a street to be laid out and established within the corporate limits of the City and having found and declared such street to be a necessary public improvement and the right of way for such street having now been acquired by purchase;

Therefore, be it resolved and this Common Council does hereby determine that all the cost and expense of the right of way so required and procurred and all of the damage occasioned by the establishment of such street shall be and is hereby ordered to be levied on and assessed against the lands, tenements and premises situate in hereinafter designated, and as a tax against the owners of the lands. tenements and premises situate therein, that the cost of the establishment of such street other than the cost of such right of way shall be a charge against the street fund.

Resolved further that all of the lands **b** and premises situate in the special assessment district bereinafter designated are deemed and hereby declared to be benefited by the laying out and establishment of the said street, and the said special assessment district is hereby fixed as follows, to-wit : All that part of the City of Ann Arbor, exclusive of the street bounded as follows, viz:

the west by North Division Onstreet;

On the south by the south line of the lands of Mary J Maynard, Leonhard Gruner and Lucy B Whitlark.

On the east by North State street:

On the north by a line drawn along the south line of lot number nine of Bower's Addition to the City of Ann Arbor, and along such line projected westerly to North Division street.

Resolved further that, and this Council does hereby require the sum of Three Thousand Dollars to be raised by tax as a special assessment on and agaiest all of the lots, parts of lots, lands, tenements and premises in and and situate in the said special asessment district and as a tax against the owners theriof, the same to be assess-

the special assessment district | ed against the said lots, parts of lots, lands and tenements according to the benefits coming to the said lands and tenements from such local improvements, and the City Assessor is hereby required to levy and assess the said sum of money aforesaid on the lands and tenements aforesaid and as a tax against the owners thereof in the manner and for the purpose aforesaid pursuant to law.

> Resolved further that the City Clerk certify this determination and do. order of assessment to the City Assessor according to law.
