 Gentlemen:

Your Board of Health beg leave to submit their monthly report for Jan. There have been four inspections this month and all such nuisances inspected have been abated.

The number of deaths for the month are seventeen. (17). Five of which were from the Hospitals, and two were visitors in the city. Thus bringing our death record to 10 per 16000 people for the month.

The city is free from contagious diseases at this time, with the exception of Tuberculosis and the Influenza.
