Gentlemen:--Your petition the Kver Milling Company, a corporation duly organized under the laws of the State of Michigan and coing business in the City of Ann Arbor, respectively shows that it is the owner of lots number two and three and the Lyman Acre in block eleven of Ormsby and Page's addition to the City of Ann Arbor, and the grist mill and flouring mill thereon and the mill race and mill pond and the embankment, water power and water privileges connected therewith and all the land, rights and priviledges mentioned and described in deeds bearing date and record as follows: December 13th 1843 recorded in liber "U" page 312, deed dated January 16th 1844 and recorded in liber "U" page 320 and 331, deed dated December 18th 1843 and recorded in liber "U" pages 362 and 363, deed dated February 12th 1844 and recorded in liber "U" pages 363 and 364, deed dated February 12th 1844 and recorded in liber "U" pages 364 and 465, deed dated March 4th 1844 and recorded in liber "U" page 418 and deed dated June 24th 1844 and recorded in liber "U" pages 706 and 707. deed dated July 7th 1844 and recorded in liber "U" pages 760 and 761, deed dated November 1st 1850 and recorded in liber 31 page 315 and deed dated December 15th 1845 and recorded in liber 31 page 706, for a more particular description of said premises reference is hereby had to said records.

And your petitioner further shows by said deeds of conveyance that it acquired the right and privilege of digging and constructing across the premises described in said conveyances and using forever such race, canal or aqueduct as might be necessary and proper for safely conducting the water of Allen's creek and its tributory streams and springs across said lands west of said Allen's creek for hydrolic purposes and for the purpose of conveying the water of said creek and tributory. streams through said mill race or aque. waters of said creek to be conveyed

duct to its said mill and that it has the right and privilege at all times of erecting on the lands along said Allen's creek or any part thereof an embankment of sufficient bulk and strength and capacity to hold water to the height of which water may at any time be used in said race, and of flowing and keeping overflowed with water from said race and occupying and using so much and such part of said land as may be included between such embankment aud such mill race as and for a reservoir of water in connection with the running and operating of said grist mill.

And your petitioner further shows that it has the right and privilege of directing, conducting and carrying the water of Allen's creek and its tributories through its said mill race or aqueduct and also the privilege of making. constructing and ferever using its flumes trunks, mill race or acqueduct for that purpose.

And your petitioner further shows that it is the owner of the water of Allen's creek and its said tributaries in said city and has the right to utilize the same as a power for operating its said mill or other purposes, and that your petitioner and its grantors have constructed and maintained a dam on or along said creek for the purpose of collecting and confining the waters of said creek to its said mill race pond or reservoir so that it may operate its said mill.

Your petitioner further represents that said City of Ann Arbor has constructed and now owns, maintains and operates a system of storm sewers and large drains on William street, Liberty street, Washington street, Huron street, Ann street, Catherine street, Main street, High street, and Miller avenue in said city, for the purpose of conveying the surface water from the streets of the greater portion of said city.

Your petitioner further shows that it is entitled to the use and to enjoy the privileges of the waters of Allen's creek and its appurtenances forever, and that the said city of Ann Arbor by means of the large drains or sewers on the streets above mentioned, wrongfully, negligently and improperly have turned, directed and caused to be emptied into said Allen creek at or near a point on the line of said creek where your petitioner has caused the

into its said mill race and at several points along its said race, large quantities of gravel, sand, stones, sediment, dirt and filth and has continued for a long time past and still continues so to do, and that the same has lodged, gathered and accumulated in your petitioner's mill race, thereby making it useless for milling purposes and putting your petitioner to great ex-pense to remove the same to the great iujury and damage of your petitioner's rights and privileges in the premises aforesaid.

Your petitioner further shows that said city of Ann Arbor has so wrongfully, improperly and negligently constructed said large drains or storm sewers that it has greatly damaged and injured said mill race by emptying large quantities of filth, dirt, stones, gravel and sediment through said large drains or storm sewers into said mill race, thus destroying the enjoyment of your petitioner's facilities therein, and making useless the milling property of your petitioner above described by polluting and rendering useless the water power necessary to operate said mill.

And your petitioner further represents that they have a large and valuable milling property in said city of Ann Arbor, operating in part by water derived from said Allen creek, so conveyed to its said mill through its said mill race and that the same has been greatly decreased in value and damaged by the said city of Ann Arbor, causing the surface water, sediment, dirt, and filth from its said streets to flow as aforesaid through said large drains or storm sewers into said Allen's creek and into said mill race, obstructing and polluting the waters of said race.

And your petitioner further represents that by reason of the construction, maintenance and operation of said storm sewers as aforesaid your petitioner therefore prays that your honorable body will investigate its said claim against said City, and give your patitioner such sum or sums as will reasonably compensate it for the damage it has occasioned your petitioner.

Having looked over the matter of the disposal of storm water on Gott street, would recommend that for a permanent improvement, an extension of the pipe be made from Hiscock street north two blocks to Pearl street, with the necessary inlets and catchbasins. It is impossible to carry the water above the gutters without having a severe washout in the street at every hard storm. Typhoid fever4

The cases of typhoid fever are of interest in as much as they developed in the neighborhood where there was a small epidemic of fever. This fever was called by many malaria. The cases that came under my observation were typical cases of typhoid fever. As a matter of fact malaria and the socalled malarial diseases up until the return of the soldiers from the south has been practically unknown in Michigan. draining the soil has Tilling and stamped on one of the greatest enemies of the Michigan pioneer, fever and ague The soil in certain secor malaria. tions of the city of Anu Arbor is gravelly and is readily permiable by water discharged into it in any manner, and if such water is poisoned by the presence of the germs of dangerous diseases, such germs may be carried along till they bring up in the wells from which people procure water for do-This must happen mestic purposes. where the excrement of persons affiicted with typhoid fever is carelessly thrown in privies without disinfection. In the older parts of the city privies and wells are in dangerous proximity.

COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS.

The cases of typhoid fever reported above resided on a hillside, the privies in the rear and higher parts of the lot and the well in the front considerably lower than the privies. All including many of those who were afflicted with fever that I had not the privilege of seeing, received their drinking water from this well which may possibly have been the source of the disease. Owing to the expense of bactericlogical and chemical examination the water was not examined. It would be well if the city would provide some means whereby such examinations could be made. Typhoid fever is a disease that can be driven from the city by attention to sanitary rules and should be unknown to us With the perfection of our sewer system and the introduction of a more effective garbage system, typhoid fever like malaria will disappear.

Ald. Dieterle offered the following ordinance:

AN ORDINANCE.

Providing for the permanent removal of telephone poles and wires within a certain district, and for the laying of underground conduits and placing wires therein, in the City of Ann Arbor, Michigan.

It is hereby ordained. that on 1. and after January 1st, 1900, it shall be unlawful for any person, persons, company or corporation to erect or maintain poles and wires for telephone purpose in the city of Ann Arbor, within the district area herein described to wit:

Washington In Street, between Ashley and Fifth Streets except as hereinafter provided; and on and after said date any person, persons, company corporation owning, controlling, or operating or maintaining such poles or wires in said city shall cause said poles and wires within said district to be taken down and permanently removed; provided that said section shall not be construed to prevent the erection and maintenance of the necessary poles within said district for the distribution of wires from the underground conduits to reach the subscribers of such person persons, company or corporation, and provided further that said distributing poles shall be set in alleys when practicable, and in any and all cases in such a manner as to not unreasonably obstruct or interfere with other proper uses of the streets and allevs.

In case of failure on the part of any person, persons, company or cor. poration so owning, controlling, operating and mointaining such poles and wires, to take down and remove the same within the time above limited, the Board of Public Works or other proper agent of the city. shall have the power and it shall be their duty, under the direction of the legislative anthority of the city, to take down and remove said poles and wires; Provided, The actual and necessary expenses of the city or of the Board of Public Works, in the employment of an agent to carry out the provisions of the preceding sections, shall be a proper charge against said person, persons, company or corporation, and such expense shall be paid by said person,
