Resolved, That a special committee be appointed and instructed to initiate negotiations with the water company relative to purchase of same.

Ald. Brown offered a substitute that special water committee look into the matter and ascertain what the water company will take for their plant.—Carried.

By Ald. Richards:

That the City Attorney be instructed to have the skeleton bill now before the legislature, pertaining to the construction of water works, filled out, and that the chair appoint a committee of four to co-operate with the attorney.—Carried.

The chair then appointed the following committee: Ald. Coon, Hamilton, Brown, Jenney.
