AN ORDINANCE to amend Section thirteen of an ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance relative to Disorderly Persons and Conduct."

The Common Council of the City of Ann Arbor ordain:

Section 1—That section thirteen of an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance relative to Disorderly Persons and Conduct" be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:—

Section 13—It shall be unlawful for any person under the age of sixteen years to wander or loiter in or about any street, alley or public place within the corporate limits of the city of Ann Arbor after the hour of eight o'clock p. m. and all persons under the age of sixteen years found loitering, wandering or rambling in any street, alley or public place or who shall or do congregate for any idle purpose or conversation in any such street, alley or public place after the hour of eight o'clock p. m. shall be deemed and are declared to be disorderly persons and on conviction shall be punished as hereinafter provided. Every person and all persons under the age of sixteen years, who shall or do congregate together to the number of three or upwards for any idle purpose in any street, alley, public building or place within the corporate limits of the City of Ann Arbor after the hour of eight o'clock p. m. and who shall not immediately disperse and depart to their respective homes or lodging places on the command, order or request of the Marshal, or any policeman, shall be

deemed and declared disorderly persons and guilty of disorderly conduct and on conviction shall be punished as hereinafter provided.

Section "2"—This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after ten days from legal publication. By Pres. Jenney:
