street from Jackson avenue to a point 75 feet east of the center street; that they then deflect to the south so that when they reach a point 75 feet west of the center of Ashley street the center of their track will be 7 feet south of the center of Huron street; that they then proceed parallel to and 7 feet from the center of Huron street to the point of curve leading to Main street tracks, and that the curve joining the Huron street track the Main street track shall have a radius of not more than 50 feet and shall join the Main street track south of the center of Huron street. That sion is also granted to lay a single track to their sub-station, from Huron street track.

And that Boland place his tracks on Huron street from Ashley to Fourth avenue, and that they be placed 7 feet north of the center; that Hawks & Angus be requested to place their "Y" on First street north or south of Huron street.
