Whereas, the Common Council having ordered the construction of a lateral sewer in sewer district No. 10, and the City Engineer having reported the probable cost thereof to the Common Council, therefore be it

Resolved, and it is hereby ordered that the Mayor and the City Clerk be authorized and required to execute under their hands and the seal of the city, lateral sewer bonds of the city of Ann Arbor under date of December 2, 1901, in the aggregate sum of \$1,761.62 being the estimated cost of said improvement, payable to bearer in four equal installments from and after the

first day of March, A. D. 1902, at the office of the City Treasurer, with interest at four per cent per annum payable annually on the first day of March in each and every year. The principal to be payable at the option of the City Treasurer, pursuant to law.
