ORDINANCE

Ald. Fischer offered the following ordinance which was given its first reading by title and on motion passed to and was given its second reading:

An Ordinance to prohibit and punish the practice of spitting and expectorating, and throwing banana and orange peelings upon the sidewalks and walks upon any street or alley, park or public grounds, or upon the floors, stairs or steps of any public hall, theatre or other building frequented by the public, or upon the floors of street cars or other vehicles used for public travel within the city of Ann Arbor.

An Ordinance relative to and entitled an Ordinance relative to Transcient Traders was given its first reading by title and on motion it passed to and was given its second reading.

Ald. Fischer offered for its third and final reading:

An Ordinance to regulate the speed of automobiles or other motor vehicles.

The Common Council of the City of Ann Arbor ordain:

Section I. No person or persons shall drive or propel any automobile or other motor vehicle on any of the streets of the City of Ann Arbor at a greater rate of speed than seven miles an hour. And all persons so driving or propelling such vehicles shall slacken their speed when approaching any crossing, sidewalk or intersecting street, to five miles per hour.

Section 2. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine not exceeding twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars for each offence; and in the imposition of such fine, the court may make a further sentence that, in the default of the payment of such a fine, the offender may be imprisoned in the common Jail for the County of Washtenaw until the payment thereof, for any period not exceeding thirty days.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force ten days from the date of the passage thereof.

Resolved, that the grading and construction of the sidewalk hereinafter mentioned is deemed and declared to be a necessary public improvement.

Therefore it is hereby ordered that a tar or asphaltum sidewalk be graded, built and constructed on and along the east side of Main street and in front of the property known as 618 N. Main street.

The elevation given being above the official city datum and along the center line of such walk, and the grade lines to consist of straight lines between the several points or stations above stated.

At the North line of St. Thomas' Church property 832.30.
