**COMMUNICATIONS.**

**From the Mayor.**

To the Honorable, the Common Council of the City of Ann Arbor.

Gentlemen: Your attention is hereby called to the condition of Martin street, which runs north from Wells street. The north half of Martin street lying between Wells street and Israel avenue has not been opened and worked, and several houses have been built upon the south end of Martin street. A small appropriation was made by the common council last year for doing this work and only a small amount is required for the work, but for some reason the work has been delayed. Those who built upon the south end of Martin street expected, and they had a right to expect, that the street would be opened and some work done upon it by the city within a reasonable time, and all of these people are bitterly complaining of the delay, and it is my opinion that in justice to those taxpayers that a sufficient appropriation should be made for opening this street, removing the apple trees and putting the street in a reasonably safe condition for public travel, and I hope this council will take such action without further delay.

To the Common Council.

Gentlemen: I have prepared and

had executed a land contract from Melvin E. Lennon and Clarence D. Lennon, to the city for the sale and purchase of their land between Cedar Bend avenue and the River, on the terms and conditions agreed upon between them and the council. I would suggest that a warrant for five hundred dollars be ordered drawn in favor of said Melvin E. Lennon and Clarence D. Lennon, for the first payment on said contract, and that the City Clerk be directed to have said contract recorded.

I have not yet been able to close the deal for the Rhodes property because the administrator must obtain license to sell from the probate court.

Mr. Weeks refuses to furnish an abstract of his property and I am not authorized to order an abstract at the expense of the city. If you will indicate what your wishes are in the matter, I shall act accordingly. However, I would not recommend that the city pay out any money for the purchase of said land without an abstract.
