To the Water Committee of the Common Council of the City of Ann Arbor

Gentlemen—The Ann Arbor Water Company would suggest that a 6 inch water main be laid on Ashley street from Miller avenue to West Huson street, and a hydrant to be placed on the corner of East Ann street and Ashley street. This is to take the place of the main ordered on West Ann street from Main street to First street and south on First street to make a distance of seven hundred feet. Making this alteration the said Company will run a pipe as called for on West Ann street from Ashley street to First street.

The said Company would also suggest that a hydrant be placed on North Seventh street four hundred feet north of West Huron street, and in the future should a house or houses be built north of the hydrant for a distance of three hundred feet, we will run a pipe for their accommodation if requested so to do.

The said Company would also recommend that a main be run on East Washington street from Thayer street to Fourteenth street south on Fourteenth to the hydrant thus making a circuit. This run to take the place of the main ordered from Ingalls street to Fourteenth street on East Washington street.

If these recommendations are concurred in, the said Company will continue a 10 inch main on East Washington street from Thayer street to Twelfth and an 8 inch main on Twelfth

from Washington street to North University avenue.
