Ann Arbor, Mich., Aug. 30th, 1909.

To the Honorable the Common Council:

Gentlemen—I desire to recommend the advisability of repairing the pavements on Huron and State streets. There are a number of bad places in both these pavements, especially on State street, and in talking with the City Engineer about the same he stated that the pavements could be placed in much better condition at a small expense. There are a number of places where the pavement has settled and the Engineer says that the bricks could be taken up and a better foundation put in. This would greatly improve the appearance of the pavements, and I believe it would also increase the wearing qualities of it.

I would therefore recommend that the Board of Works be authorized to make the necessary repairs to our pavements, and that the work be done before October first if possible.
