Officers Reports. Engineer On Storm Water.

Honorable Common Council; Gentlemen-l desire to call your attention to the custom on the part of certain parties, of connecting the drainage from roofs of buildings with the sanitary sewers. The sewers were not designed to carry this kind of drainage, but were designed to carry sewage from residences only. At times our sewers are carrying very nearly their designed capacity, and when we take into account the probable growth of the city, it will be seen that the entire capacity of our sewers will be needed for residence drainage. If the roof water could be let into the sewers intermittently. perhaps it could be taken care of; but such is not the case. All the water falling on the roofs of buildings connected with the sewers enters them at about the same time. If this practice is continued there can be but one result and that is that portions of our sanitary sewer system will have to be rebuilt. I consider this a serious matter and address you in writing, as I desire this communication to be a matter of record.
