Board of Review.

To the Common Council: Gentlemen—The undersigned City Clerk submits the following report of the Board of Review proceedings on vacating Mineral st. in the City of Ann Arbor, Michigan.

The Council sitting as such Board of Review, in pursuance to its order and appointment for that purpose met at the Council Chamber on Thursday, October 21st, 1909, at 2 o'clock p. m., and adjourned to Board of Public Works room. The roll was called and the following Aldermen were found present: Ald. Georg, Stark, Murray, Sweet, Staffan, Pipp, St. James, Sherk, Manwaring, Blaich, Lutz, Paton, Pres. Mills, 13.

The Council entered upon the review of said proposal (closing of Mineral st.) Due proof of notice of such meeting was filed. After hearing all persons desiring to be heard the following resolution was offered.

By Ald. Murray, Whereas, the Common Council has been applied to in writing by ten or more freeholders residing within the City of Ann Arbor,

praying that a certain street or highway within the corporate limits of said City, known as Mineral st., lying between Willow and Bath sts, be legally closed, now therefore

Resolved that this Board does hereby determine that it is advisable to close all that part of Mineral st. lying between Willow st. and Bath st.

Resolved, further, that the City Clerk do report the proceedings of this Board of Review to the Common Council at its next regular meeting.
