By Ald. Pipp:

Whereas, this common council has been applied to in writing by a majority of the owners of the lands, which are liable to be assessed for the payment of the construction of the same, praying for the grading and paving of Fourth av. from north line of Huron st. to south line of Ann st., within the corporate limits of the city of Ann Arbor, Michigan; and

Whereas, the grading and paving of that part of Fourth av., within the limits aforesaid, is deemed and hereby declared to be a necessary public

improvement; therefore,

Resolved, and it is hereby declared to be the purpose of the common council, to cause Fourth av., within the limits aforesaid, to be graded and paved under the charter and ordinances of the city of Ann Arbor, and in pursuance of the prayer of said petitioners.

Resolved, further, that the cost and expense of the construction of such public improvement shall be charged, assessed and paid as follows: All street and public alley intersections, engineering expenses and twenty per cent. of the remainder shall be paid by the city, and the remainder shall be assessed and paid by special assessment levied and assessed according to benefits on and against all the lands, tenements and premises lying on or fronting Fourth av., within the limits aforesaid.

Resolved, further, that the said petition, along with this determination, be and the same is hereby referred to the Board of Public Works, with directions to report to the council with all convenient dispatch suitable plans with specifications for the said proposed improvement, the kind and quality of material to be used therefor, together with an estimate of the probable cost and expense of such public improvement.

Proposed Charter Amendment.

By Ald. Manwaring: Resolved, that section 186 of the Charter of the City of Ann Arbor, as amended May 10, 1899, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 186. No bond, note or other obligation, or evidence of indebtedness of said corporation, except orders on the treasurer, as hereinafter provided, and also except bonds for sewerage and paving purposes, shall ever be given or issued by said corporation, or by any officer thereof, in his official capacity, whereby the said city shall become obligated to pay any money, unless the same shall have been duly authorized by resolution of the common council of the city of Ann Arbor by a two-thirds vote of the members elect, and shall have been submitted to and voted for by three-fifths of the electors of said city voting thereon, in conformity to this act; but the Common Council may allow just claims against the city, and may issue orders therefor on the treasurer, or payable on presentation from any moneys then in the treasury, on the first day of

February thereafter; but such second named class of orders shall not, in any fiscal year, exceed the aggregate taxes levied in such year for the payment of the same. All moneys collected for the use of the city shall be paid into the city treasury, and no moneys shall be paid from the treasury unless it shall have been previously appropriated by the common council to the purpose for which it shall be drawn. The treasurer shall pay out no money except upon the written warrant of the mayor and the city clerk, which warrant shall specify the fund from which the money is to be paid: Provided, That school moneys shall be paid to the treasurer of school district number one of the city of Ann Arbor, upon the warrant of the president and secretary of said board. The common council may, at any regular meeting thereof, by resolution duly adopted by a majority of all the members elect, authorize the issuing of bonds to the amount not exceeding one hundred and fifty thousand dollars outstanding at any one time, for the purpose of paving any alley, street or streets in such city, such bonds to run for a period not exceeding ten years from the date of their issue, and at a rate of interest not exceeding five per-cent. per annum, and the common council for the purpose of carrying out this provision may pass such ordinance or ordinances as may be deemed necessary.

Resolution laid on table for thirty days, according to law by the following vote: Yeas, Ald. Georg, Stark, Murray, Hochrein, Sweet, Staffan, Pipp, Sherk, Manwaring, Smith, Blaich, Lutz, Paton, Pres. Mills, 14. Nays, none.

Mr. St. James has been an exceptionally valuable member of this council, and his resignation will prove a distinct loss, not only to this council in its deliberations, but to the city of Ann Arbor as well. Resolved, further, that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to Mr. St. James by the clerk, with the earnest wish of each member of this council for his speedy recovery.

Huron st. and Fifth av.; 5th ward, engine house, cor. Swift and Pontiac sts.; 6th ward, engine house on E. University av.; 7th ward, ward building on Mary st.

And also for charter election and enrollment on April 4, 1910, said election and enrollment to take place in the different wards as follows:

1st ward, ward voting room, basement of city hall; 2nd ward, ward building on S. Ashley st.; 3rd ward, store, No. 115 E. Ann st.; 4th ward, store, No. 204 N. Fourth av.; 5th ward, ward building, cor. Swift and Pontiac sts.; 6th ward, basement of 6th ward school on E. University av.; 7th ward, ward building on Mary st.

Adopted as follows: Yeas, Ald. Georg, Stark, Murray, Hochrein, Sweet, Staffan, Pipp, Sherk, Manwaring, Smith, Blaich, Lutz, Paton, Pres. Mills, 14. Nays, none.

Moved by Ald. Murray: That the council proceed to ballot for City Physician. Adopted.

Ballot was taken and Dr. Robert G. MacKenzie received the unanimous vote of those present, 14.

Chair declared Dr. Robert G. MacKenzie elected to the office of city physician for the ensuing term.

By Ald. Georg: Resolved, That a committee be appointed to investigate and report to the council upon some method of regulating the building of houses in the city of Ann Arbor, with reference to their distance from each other and from the street front. Adopted and referred to Ordinance committee.

Moved by Ald. Sherk: That the matter of discontinuing the construction of tar walks in city be referred to the Ordinance committee.

Adopted as follows: Yeas, Ald. Georg, Stark, Hochrein, Sweet, Staffan, Pipp, Sherk, Manwaring, Smith, Blaich, Paton, Pres. Mills, 12. Nays, Ald. Murray, Lutz, 2.

Moved by Ald. Georg: That an amendment to charter be presented by special charter committee relative to uniform curb and gutters.

Adopted as follows: Yeas, Ald. Georg, Stark, Murray, Hochrein, Sweet, Staffan, Pipp, Sherk, Manwaring, Smith, Blaich, Lutz, Paton, Pres. Mills, 14. Nays, none.

Moved by Ald. Smith: That the Park Commission be asked to present some plan whereby automobiles can be used on the boulevard. Adopted.
