**Petition to Pave Alley.**

To the Common Council of the City of Ann Arbor: Gentlemen—Whereas, Elizabeth G. Lum, on or about the 6th day of October, 1900, deeded to the city of Ann Arbor the following piece or parcel of land, to wit: Commencing at a point on the north line of East Huron st. one hundred feet east of the south west corner of block one north of Huron st., range five east, according to the recorded plat of the city of Ann Arbor, running thence north on a line parallel with the east line of North Fourth av. to the south line of East Ann st., thence east on the south line of East Ann st. twelve feet, thence south on a line parallel with the east line of North Fourth av. to the north line of Huron st., thence south along the north line of Huron st. twelve feet to the place of beginning, to be used as a public alley through said block, therefore, we the undersigned property owners along said piece of land so deeded to said city for a public alley, do hereby petition your honorable body to cause said alley or piece of land above described to be graded and paved, to the end that said alley may be suitable for public use. #### Report of the Board of Election Inspectors.

To the Common Council, City of Ann Arbor: Gentlemen—We, the undersigned inspectors of election, appointed by resolution of the common council June 28th, 1910, to conduct the meeting of electors of the city of Ann Arbor called by order of the common council for the 6th day of July, 1910, to determine by ballot and authorize the raising by taxation the sum of three thousand, eight hundred ten and sixty five one hundredths dollars, for the purpose of purchasing the lands known as the fair grounds, respectfully report the result of said electors meeting as follows: Due notice of the said electors meeting having been given pursuant to law, the meeting assembled at the city hall voting room in the city of Ann Arbor, and the polls were open at ten o'clock in the forenoon, and held open until four o'clock in the afternoon, on the

6th day of July, 1910. The question submitted and determined at the said electors meeting was: "Shall the common council be authorized to raise by tax the sum of three thousand, eight hundred ten and sixty-five one hundredths dollars for the cost of the purchase of the lands known as the fair grounds for public park purposes." There were cast upon said question in all 401 votes and the said votes were cast as follows: For the fair grounds special tax, Yes, 351 votes. For the fair grounds special tax, No, 50 votes. Total number of votes in majority favoring the purchase of said lands, three hundred and one.

the sum of three thousand, eight hundred ten dollars and sixty-five cents for the cost of the purchase of the lands known as the fair grounds, for public park purposes, and it being made to appear by the return and the report of the inspectors of the said electors meeting, held pursuant to law on the 6th day of July, 1910, that the electors of the said city of Ann Arbor have by ballot vote authorized this common council to raise by tax upon the taxable property of the city of Ann Arbor the sum of three thousand, eight hundred ten and sixty-five one hundredth dollars for the cost of purchase of the lands known as the fair grounds, therefore be it

Resolved, That it is hereby ordered that the sum of three thousand, eight hundred ten and sixty-five one hundredth dollars be and the same is hereby levied and assessed on and against the taxable property of the city of Ann Arbor, Michigan, and the same is ordered to be spread on the tax roll of said city of Ann Arbor, for the year nineteen hundred ten (1910), and the city assessor is hereby ordered and required to spread, assess and levy the said sum of three thousand, eight hundred, ten and sixty-five one hundredths dollars on the regular city assessment rolls for the year A. D. 1910, and against the taxable property of the city of Ann Arbor pursuant to law, said tax to be spread upon said assessment roll under the heading "Fair Grounds".

Resolved, further, that the city clerk do certify this resolution and order of assessment to the city assessor without delay.
