Special Committee on Garbage.

To the Honorable the Common Council: Gentlemen—Your committee, to whom the matter of garbage was referred, respectfully recommends:

1st. That the city adopt the can system of collecting, that is, the collector to leave a clean can in place of one removed, that has been filled or partly filled.

2nd. That the contractor furnish all cans of a uniform size, not less than 15 inches in diameter and 18 inches high inside.

3rd. That collections be made 2 or 3 times a week.

4th. That contractors and collectors be licensed.

5th. That the party, having garbage for collection, pay to the contractor such price per month as his bid may be to the city, to be paid for only such months as the contractor is required to remove such garbage.

6th. That where two families are so situated that it is convenient for them to use one can, without overloading between the times of collecting, they are to have such privilege and pay the price of one can only.

7th. That the City Attorney frame an ordinance to cover the proposed system and present same to the Ordinance committee as soon as possible.

8th. That specifications be drawn up and bids asked for by the present committee as soon after ordinance is passed as is possible.
