From Ann Arbor Machine Co.—
March 20, 1911.

To the Members of the Common Council of Ann Arbor, Mich.: The Ann Arbor Machine Co. hereby petitions for the privilege of constructing a driveway from their dock, extending about 16 ft. from the dock, parallel with the Michigan Central switch.

We agree to make a concrete wall on the north side of this driveway, with a railing of sufficient height to protect any stray pedestrian from injury. We further agree to stand responsible for any damage that might possibly occur from this same incline driveway. We also agree to remove this driveway at any time the Common Council may order us to do so.

The portion of the street where this is to be constructed is not used by the public at the present at all, but has been for some time in use by the Ann Arbor Machine Co., with planks, for hauling presses to their dock. By

doing away with the planks and constructing a driveway, it will obstruct the traffic of Broadway street much less than in the old way, as no rope will then be stretched across the street for the purpose of hauling presses to their loading dock.

This new construction will allow the team to drive from the street right on their loading dock.

Report from Park Commissioners. SIXTH ANNUAL REPORT OF THE BOARD OF PARK COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF ANN ARBOR.

To the Honorable Mayor and Common Council of the City of Ann Arbor: For the information of the mayor, common council and the citizens of the city of Ann Arbor, the Board of Park commissioners make the following report:

Fair Grounds.

During the past year we have acquired title to the Fair Grounds, consisting of nineteen and five one-hundredths acres of land, at a cost to the city of only four thousand and ten dollars and 69-100 (\$4010.69). A fair valuation of the property is twenty thousand dollars.

In acquiring title to this property, we agreed with the Ann Arbor Driving Club, that had certain rights therein, among other things, to build them a stable containing twenty stalls. We moved old buildings to the south-east corner of the property for this purpose, and sold at public sale sheds and buildings to the amount of two hundred and eighteen dollars and 50-100 (\$218.50), which will pay for the moving and carpenter work on the stable.

We are tearing down the old grand stand, and using the lumber to put the other stand in good condition.

There is no shelter in case of rain for the women and children that visit Cedar Bend Park, and we reserved one of the buildings, that is in splendid condition, and intend to move it down there for that purpose.

It has been called to the attention of the board that the Council has under consideration a proposition by which Baldwin avenue will be extended to Ferdon road. We are much in favor of this, and hope to see it brought about, as it will assist us in carrying out our Park system. When this is done, the Board has agreed with Mr. John Schmutz to open a street between his property and the

Park running from the proposed extension of Baldwin avenue to Granger avenue, thereby giving an entrance to the Park from the south.

We have arranged with the Board of Education for the use of that part of Park within the race track, under certain conditions, that we will submit in a separate report.

North Boulevard.

The North boulevard has been opened and graded a distance of one and one-half miles from the Whitmore Lake road, to the north line of Kellog street, extended west. The Board intends to continue it to Cedar street, which, for the present, will be its south entrance. This drive will be gravelled and put in condition for public travel in the early spring, and we can assure you that there will be no prettier or more picturesque drive than this in the state of Michigan. This drive has been acquired, through the efforts of the Board, without cost to the city, and at an expenditure of four thousand four hundred fifty-six and 38-100 dollars (\$4456.38), as follows:

West Park.

Besides the general care and attention given this Park, we have built a fine tennis court, intended particularly for the young ladies of the city, which will be ready for use at the proper time. We have also built certain fences around this Park.

Other Parks.

The other Parks of the city we have planted, gravelled drives, built bridges and done work necessary to be done on them.

Our Park system has grown to such an extent that it became necessary to employ a superintendent of Parks and, in conjunction with the University, we have employed Mr. Charles H. Otis at a salary of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) per year.

By Ald. Goodyear: Whereas, this Common Council has been applied to in writing by a majority of the owners of the lands which are liable to be assessed for the payment of the construction of the same, praying for the grading and paving of State st. from the south line of Monroe st. to the north line of Packard st., within the corporate limits of the city of Ann Arbor, Michigan; and

Whereas, the grading and paving of that part of State st., within the limits aforesaid, is deemed and declared to be a necessary public improvement; therefore

Resolved, and it is hereby declared to be the purpose of the Common Council to cause State st., within the limits aforesaid, to be graded and paved under the charter and ordinances of the city of Ann Arbor, and in pursuance of the prayer of said petitioners.

Resolved, further, that the cost and expense of the construction of such public improvement shall be charged, assessed and paid as follows: All street and public alley intersections, engineering expenses and twenty per cent of the remainder shall be paid by

th city, and the remainder shall be assessed and paid by special assessment levied and assessed according to benefits on and against all the lands, tenements and premises lying on or fronting State st., within the limits aforesaid.

Resolved, further, that the said petition, along with this determination, be and the same is hereby referred to the Board of Public Works, with directions to report to the Council with all convenient dispatch suitable plans with specifications for the said proposed improvement, the kind and quality of material to be used therefore, together with an estimate of the probable cost and expense of such public improvement.
