## St. Sprinkling District No. 12.

By Ald. Murray: Resolved, That. it is necessary and that the common council of the city of Ann Arbor do declare that they deem it necessary that Hill st. from Oxford road to Church st., that Oxford road from Hill st. to Washtenaw av., that Lincoln av. from Hill st. to Cambridge road, that Olivia av., from Hill st. to Cambridge road and that Forest av. from South University av. to Cambridge road should be wet down or sprinkled, to the end that the health and comfort of the people may thereby be conserved, therefore,

Resolved, That under the provisions of an ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance relative to street sprinkiing and providing a method of raisiň by Taxation the money to pay the costs and expenses thereof," passed July 17, 1899, the common council herehy determines that upon a petition of a majority of the foot frontage owners of taxable land on Hill st. between Oxford road and Church st. and on Oxford road between Hill st. and Washtenaw av. and on Lincoln av between Hill st. and Cambridge road and on Olivia av. between Hill st. and Cambridge road and on Forest as. between South University av. and Cambridge road, said Hill st. firom Oxford road to Church st., said (1xford road from Hill st. to Washtenaw
av., said Lincoln av. from Hill st. to Cambridge road, said Olivia av, from Hill st. to Cambridge road, and said Forest ave. from South University av. to Cambridge road shall be spriakled and wet down, and the costs and expenses thereof, less the costs of the street intersections and less the woportion that may be paid by the Detroit, Jackon and Chicago Railway, shall be assessed and taxed to the owners of the land benefited thereby.
