Resolved, and it is hereby ordered that the Mayor and the City Clerk are hereby authorized and required to execute, under their hands and the seal of the City of Ann Arbor, parement bonds of the City of Ann Arbor under date of August 1st, 1911, for Fourteen Thousand, Five Hundred Dollars $(\$ 14,500.00)$, that being the cost of such improvement, payab!e to bearer, in ten equal annual installments, from and after the first day of August. 1911, at the office of the City Treasurer, with interest at four per cent per annum, payable annua'ly on the first day of August in each and every year, principal to be payable at the option of the City Treasurer pursuant to law.
