Meeting called to order by Pres. Mills. Present: Pres. Mills, Ald. Schmid, Hochrein, Koernke, Pipp, Manwaring, Goodyear, Ramsay, Lutz, Lindenschmitt—10. Absent: Ald. Murray, Sweet, Flynn, Sherk—4.

Mayor Walz explained that his request, to have regular meeting of March 18 adjourned to this evening, was made to make it possible for the council to change the date of election relative to proposed purchase of water works, if the citizens so requested at mass meeting held Tuesday evening. The mayor also reported that the relics from battleship Maine, as per communication from Congressman Wedemeyer, were very likely on the way to Ann Arbor.

Street Committee Report.

Prof. Frank Leverett presented tables on sinking fund accumulations which were prepared by Prof. James Glover. The information was very thankfully received and the following resolution was offered:

By Ald. Schmid: Resolved, that this council extends a vote of thanks to Messrs. James Glover and Frank Leverett for the valuable information given and for the interest shown in the settlement of the water works question. Adopted by unanimous vote.

Mayor Walz presented the following resolution which was adopted unanimously:

Whereas, our city has been desirous of co-operating with the Regents of the University of Michigan in securing the erection of a detention hospital to guard our citizens and the student body from the spread of contagious and communicable diseases, and

Whereas, our city was unable to secure the necessary funds for the above purpose without an Act of the Legislature, which act could not be secured without a special message from Governor Osborn to the special session of the Legislature, and

Whereas, Governor Osborn, fully understanding the needs of our city and other cities in the state of Michigan in this respect, very promptly secured the passage of the desired legislation, therefore, be it

Resolved, that we extend to Governor Osborn, Senator Newton and Representatives Kalmbach and Rankin, a vote of thanks as a slight token of our appreciation of their efforts in securing the passage of the bill enabling our city to secure a detention hospital.
