By Ald. Lutz: Whereas, Public Act No. 1 of the Legislature of the state of Michigan, approved March 8th, 1912, authorizing any city within this state, having a population of not less than five thousand inhabitants, to borrow any sum of money not exceeding 3 mills on the dollar of the assessed valuation of such city, to be used exclusively for the purpose of purchasing grounds, rights, privileges, materials, and in making improvements connected with, and for the sole purpose of providing such city, and the inhabitants thereof, with a detention hospital or hospitals, or for the care and treatment of persons afflicted with contagious or communicable diseases, and

Whereas, at a special election held in the city of Ann Arbor, state of Michigan, on the 27th day of August, 1912, the qualified electors of said city did vote to authorize the raising the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars by loan, such sum when raised to be used for the purpose of constructing a detention hospital, said hospital to be erected upon a site to be furnished by the University of Michigan, said sum of money to be turned over to the Regents of the University of Michigan for the purpose of building a contagious disease hospital in said city, the University of Michigan agreeing to furnish a site for the same, build a hospital to cost at least aforesaid amount, and equip and maintain it in perpetuity, furnishing necessary medical attendance and nursing, such hospital shall be open at all times for the reception of any patients taken sick in the city of Ann Arbor with contagious disease, the number of such patients shall be limited only by the full capacity of such hospital, the rates charged by the University shall always be in accordance with those charged other patients in the other University hospitals of Ann Arbor, Michigan, receiving similar accommodations, therefore

Resolved, that the Mayor and City Clerk be and are directed to sign and issue Detention Hospital bonds, in the sum of twenty five thousand dollars (\$25,000.00), dated February 1st, 1913, and deposit them with the City Treasurer, taking his receipt therefor, said bonds to be of the denomination of \$500.00 each, and payable \$2,-500.00 annually, commencing August

1st, 1914, and to draw interest at the rate of four per cent. per annum, principal and interest payable on August 1st of each year at the office of the City Treasurer in the city of Ann Arbor, Michigan.

Arbor, Mich.: Sirs—In the matter of
the petition of the Come-Packt Fur-
niture Co., which was referred to me
with power to act on Nov. 4th, I beg
to report as follows:

The drain of the Come-Packt Fur-
niture Co. was broken at the time the
sanitary sewer was laid on Hill st.,
and was not repaired. I had this
break repaired and found it neces-
sary to clean out the drain and do
further work before said drain was
in serviceable condition. The entire
cost of the work was about \$18.00,
and I have sent to the Come-Packt

Furniture Co. a bill for \$8.37 which
is the portion of the expense which
should be borne by them.

The drain was left in first class
condition upon completion of this
work.
