By Ald. Prochnow: Resolved, that the number of regular patrolmen of the police force be increased from seven to eight, and the position night clerk abolished. Resolved, further, that the new man be placed on regular duty in turn about with the other patrolmen, and that all be uniformed alike, with exception of indications of rank. Resolved, further, that there be a patrolman or the chief in the police office at all times, day and night, when not answering an urgent call.
