Whereas, the cost of the site to be furnished by the City will be Twenty-Five Thousand, Five Hundred Dollars (\$25,500.00,) therefore, be it

Resolved, that this Common Council hereby proposes to purchase said lands, and that they be turned over to the State of Michigan for the purpose of establishing and maintaining an Epileptic Colony thereon and that said lands remain the property of the State of Michigan so long as it shall maintain said epileptic colony thereon, and upon the abandonment of said colony to revert to the City of Ann Arbor, subject, however, to the approval of the duly qualified electors of said City, at a special election to be held pursuant to the statute and charter of said City in such cases made and provided. Be it further,

Resolved, that a special election be held in the City of Ann Arbor upon the 13th, of October, 1913, for the purpose and object of submitting to the duly qualified electors of the City of Ann Arbor the question of raising the sum of Twenty-five Thousand, Five Hundred (\$25,500.00) by loan, such funds when raised to be used for the purpose of purchasing land and turning the same over to the State of Michigan, said land being the Tower Farm west of the City of Ann Arbor and consisting of 503 acres, for the purpose of establishing an epileptic colony. Be it further,

Resolved, that said election be held in the several wards of the City of Ann Arbor, Michigan, as follows:

1st ward, voting room basement of the City Hall.

2nd ward, ward building on S. Ashley St.

3rd ward, ward building on Miller Ave.

4th ward, Voting room in basement of New Armory, cor. Ann and Fifth Ave.

5th ward, Ward building cor. Swift and Pontiac Sts.

6th ward, basement of sixth ward school E. University Ave.

7th ward, ward building Mary St.

Resolved, further, that the City Clerk be and is hereby authorized to issue the usual call for said special election pursuant to the State law and the Charter of said City, and to cause to be printed ballots for the use of the electors at said special election, which ballots shall be printed upon

white paper of equal width and length and shall read:

Ald. Schultz presented an ordinance to amend Sections 3 and 6 of "An ordinance relative to sidewalks," which was given its third reading as follows:

An Ordinance to amend sections three and six of An Ordinance entitled, "An ordinance Relative to Sidewalks." passed March 6th, 1893; approved March 11th, 1893; Amended February 17th, 1896; July 18th, 1898; April 16th, 1900; September 16th, 1901; May 18th, 1903.

The Common Council of the City of Ann Arbor ordain:

Section 1. That sections three and six of an ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance Relative to Sidewalks," passed March 6th, 1893, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 3. Within the corporate limits of the City of Ann Arbor all sidewalks shall hereafter be constructed of stone flagging or artificial stone (cement) and of no other material.

Provided, however, that the Com-

mon Council shall have the power and authority in its discretion to authorize the construction or repair of a tar or asphaltum sidewalk on or along any street or avenue within the corporate limits aforesaid. All work done and all material used shall be in all things first-class, and satisfactory to the board of public works.

Section 6. Hereafter it shall be unlawful to build or construct within the corporate limits of the City of Ann Arbor any sidewalk of plank, tar or asphaltum or of any material not called for or stated by this ordinance, but plank, tar or asphaltum sidewalks now constructed and now in use may be repaired whenever ordered by the Common Council or directed by the board of public works.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on and after legal publication.

The chair put the question, "Shall this ordinance pass?"

Passed by following vote: Yeas, Ald. Schultz, Hanselmann, Pipp, Flynn, Rash, Lutz, Sink, Pres. Schmid, 8. Nays, none.
