Ordinance Committee.

Ald. Schultz presented an ordinance to amend An Ordinance Relative to the Use of Streets and other Public Places, which was given its third reading as follows.

An Ordinance to amend an ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance Relative to the Use of Streets and other Public Places", passed November 4th, 1895; approved November 5th, 1895; amended June 5th, 1899.

The Common Council of the City of Ann Arbor ordain:

Sec. 1 That section 18 of an ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance Relative to the Use of Streets and other Public Places", passed November 4th, 1895; approved November 5th, 1895; amended June 5th, 1899, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 18. On all residence streets, lawn extensions may be made which shall, however, not interfere with the width of roadways as follows: In all streets of the width of three rods the roadway shall be twenty-five feet wide extending twelve and one-half feet on either side of the center line of the said street. In all streets the width of four rods, the roadway shall be left thirty-four feet wide, extending seventeen feet on either side of the center line thereof; and all other streets the width of the roadway and of the lawn extension shall be regulated by special resolution in each case: PROVIDED, That upon streets wherein street car tracks have been laid, the width of the road shall be made five feet greater than hereinbefore prescribed, the said roadway to be evenly divided by the center line of the street.

The Board of Public Works shall prescribe the width and mode of construction; PROVIDED, further, that

the Common Council may change the width of the roadway of any street whenever it shall deem it advisable so to do.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on and after legal publication.

The Chair put the question, "Shall this ordinance pass?"

Moved by Ald. Prochnow, as an amendment, to include cement walks along property on northeast and southeast corners of First and Liberty sts. and west side of First st. south from Liberty st. to curb line.

Street Committee.

Murray's 1st Sub-division in the City of Ann Arbor presented to the Council for acceptance.

Water Committee.

To the Common Council: Gentlemen—Your committee, to whom the list of water mains ordered by the Council was referred, respectfully recommend that six-inch water mains be laid on Hill st., from Oswego st. east to Prof. Dieterle's residence; on Washtenaw av. from present hydrant at Fair Oaks Parkway to Fred McOmber residence; on Hiscock st. from

Miner to Fountain sts.

We further recommend that main on East Ann st. be lowered from Clark st. east, and that Wood & Brooks be allowed to make an extension of 150 feet of four-inch water pipe on "Brook Wood Place" on the same terms as at present, with the Ann Arbor Water Company.

We further recommend that the Ann Arbor Water Company put in all necessary service connections, the City to pay differences between actual cost and ten dollars.

Resolved, further, That the City Clerk do advertise the same according to law.

By Alderman George Lutz:

Whereas, Act Number 5 of the Public Acts of Michigan, for the year 1870, and the acts amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto, and Act Number 294 of the Local Acts of Michigan, for the year 1901, authorize the city of Ann Arbor, Michigan, to purchase the water-works plant, property, business, rights and franchises and all appurtenances thereto of the

Ann Arbor Water company, and issue the bonds of the city of Ann Arbor in payment therefor; provided, that authority to acquire said public utility and issue said bonds in payment therefor be granted by the affirmative vote of the electors of the city of Ann Arbor, voting thereon at a regular or special municipal election; and

Whereas, by virtue of the laws aforesaid, the Common Council of the city of Ann Arbor has the power to fix the time and place of the payment of the principal and interest of the debt thus authorized to be created, and to authorize the issue of the bonds of said city of Ann Arbor in any sum not exceeding Four Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$450,000.00), and in such denominations as said Common Council shall determine; provided, that the bonds so authorized shall not be sold for less than par value thereof, and the rate of interest thereon shall not exceed four percent; and

Whereas, at two special elections held in the city of Ann Arbor, Michigan, upon October 13, 1913, the qualified electors of said city of Ann Arbor did, by the affirmative vote of more than three-fifths of the electors voting at said elections, authorize the city of Ann Arbor, Michigan, to purchase upon January 31, 1914, from the Ann Arbor Water company, for the sum of Four Hundred and Fifty Thousands Dollars (\$450,000.00), the water-works plant, property, business, rights and franchises, and all appurtenances thereto, of the Ann Arbor Water company, used by it in supplying water to the city of Ann Arbor and the inhabitants thereof; and pay for the same by issuing bonds the city of Ann Arbor in the sum of Four Hundred and Fifty Thousands Dollars (\$450,000.00), bearing four percent interest per annum, payable semi-annually, upon the first days of August and February of each year, at the office of the City Treasurer of Ann Arbor, Michigan; therefore,

Resolved, that the Mayor and City Clerk be and they are hereby directed to sign and issue bonds, to be designated City Water-Works Bonds, in the sum of Four Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$450,000.00), dated January 31, 1914, and deposit them with the City Treasurer, taking his receipt therefor, and said bonds shall be in denominations of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) each, and shall mature as follows:

Bonds Number 1 to 44 inclusive, maturing February 1st, 1920.

Bonds Number 45 to 90 inclusive, maturing February 1st, 1921.

Bonds Number 91 to 138 inclusive, maturing February 1st, 1922.

Bonds Number 139 to 188 inclusive, maturing February 1st, 1923.

Bonds Number 189 to 240, inclusive, maturing February 1st, 1924.

Bonds Number 241 to 294 inclusive, maturing February 1st, 1925.

Bonds Number 295 to 350 inclusive, maturing February 1st, 1926.

Bonds Number 351 to 410 inclusive, maturing February 1st, 1927.

Bonds Number 411 to 472 inclusive, maturing February 1st, 1928.

Bonds Number 473 to 538 inclusive, maturing February 1st, 1929.

Bonds Number 539 to 606 inclusive, maturing February 1st, 1930.

Bonds Number 607 to 676 inclusive, maturing February 1st, 1931.

Bonds Number 677 to 748 inclusive, maturing February 1st, 1932.

Bonds Number 749 to 822 inclusive, maturing February 1st, 1933.

Bonds Number 823 to 900 inclusive, maturing February 1st, 1934.

The principal payable on the first day of February of each year above specified, and the interest payable on the first days of August and February of each year, commencing with the first day of August, 1914, at the office of the City Treasurer of Ann Arbor, Michigan.

Resolved, further, that the City Treasurer dispose of said bonds according to the provisions of the contract now existing between said city of Ann Arbor and the said Ann Arbor Water company, made by the proposal by the city of Ann Arbor to the Ann Arbor Water company to purchase said public utility, passed by the resolution of the Common Council upon September 15, 1913, and the acceptance of said proposal in writing by the Ann Arbor Water company upon the 16th day of September, 1913.

FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS in lawful money of the United States of America, at the office of the city treasurer of said city, on or before the First Day of February, A. D. 19—, with interest at the rate of four percent per annum, payable semi-annually on the First Day of August and the First Day of February in each year, for the payment of which sum and interest, the said city is hereby held and firmly bound, and its faith and credit are hereby pledged.

This bond is one of a series of bonds of like date and tenor, amounting in the aggregate to Four Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$450,000.00), issued for the purpose of defraying the cost and expense of the purchase from the Ann Arbor Water company of the water-works plant, property, rights and franchises and all appurtenances thereto.

This bond is issued under the authority and in accordance with the provisions of Act No. 5 of the Public Acts of Michigan for the year 1870 and the acts amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto and Act No. 294 of the Local Acts of Michigan for the year 1901; and also by virtue of a resolution of the Common Council of the city of Ann Arbor passed upon September 16th, 1913.

In testimony whereof, we, the undersigned, Mayor and City Clerk of said city of Ann Arbor, being duly authorized to execute this obligation on its behalf, have hereunto set our hands and affixed the seal of said city this 31st day of January, A. D. 1914.
