ORDINANCE COMMITTEE.

Ald. Schultz presented the following ordinance for its third reading:

An ordinance to amend section one of an ordinance entitled, "An ordinance to restrain and regulate the running at large of domesticated rabbits, hares or chickens, ducks, geese or other poultry," passed August 20th, 1906; approved August 21st, 1906.

The Common Council of the City of Ann Arbor ordain:

Sec. 1. That Section 1 of an ordinance entitled, "An ordinance to restrain and regulate the running at large of domesticated rabbits, hares or chickens, ducks, geese or other poultry," passed August 20th, 1906; approved August 21st, 1906, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons being the owner or owners, possessor or possessors, or person or persons having in charge or care any domesticated rabbits, hares or chickens, ducks, geese or other poultry, to permit or allow any of the same to go at large at any

time within the limits of said city, or to keep, park or harbor any domesticated rabbits, hares or chickens, ducks, geese or other poultry within two hundred feet of any public or private hospital or school house within the said city of Ann Arbor, to the damage or annoyance of any of its inhabitants.

This ordinance shall take effect after legal publication.

The chair put the question, "Shall this ordinance pass?"

Not passed by following vote: Yeas, none. Nays, Ald. Schultz, Fiegel, Hanselmann, A. Lutz, Koernke, Flynn, Sherk, Hubbard, Rash, Groves, G. Lutz, Sink, Pres. Schmid, 13.

Moved by Ald. Groves, that the Health Officer be requested to arrest all persons, without discrimination, creating nuisance in violation of city ordinance in Ann Arbor, and prosecute them under city ordinance or state law.

CITY ATTORNEY'S REPORT.

To the Honorable, the Common Council: Gentlemen—In the matter of the petition of Homer P. Finley for damages for injuries received owing to a defective sidewalk, which was referred to the sidewalk committee and myself, I beg leave to report as follows: That a settlement can be made in the case for the sum of \$300.00 in full of the claim. Mr. G. Frank Allmendinger to pay one-half of that amount. This makes a settlement for the city for the sum of \$150.00. I feel that in view of the facts in the case that the settlement is a reasonable one, and therefore recommend that the settlement be made accordingly, and that a release from all damages be executed by Mr. Finley to the city upon the payment of the same.
