Sewer Committee.

To the Honorable, the Common Council: Gentlemen—Your committee, to whom was referred the complaint of F. Weinberg in regard to Allen's creek, begs here to recommend that the Board of Public Works be and are hereby ordered by this Council to have Allen's creek cleaned out across Fifth ave., also to have the culvert across Madison and along the east side of Sauer's mill on Fourth ave cleaned out.

Your committee would also recommend that the City Attorney notify the following property owners to clean Allen's creek across their property: Mr. Weeks, Mr. Heck, Mr. Rohde and Mr. F. Weinberg.

Your committee would further recommend that the manhole on the east side of the Huron river on the Wall street sewer be raised to the elevation of the manhole on Wall street and made water tight, and that lamp hole pipe on the west side of the river on Wall street sewer be raised sufficient to keep the water from the river out of said sewer.

In the matter of cleaning the creek back of Mr. Jaegers property at 134 Philip st., your committee found this creek in an unsanitary condition and have turned the matter over to the Board of Health.

Street Committee.

Hon. Common Council, City: Gentlemen—Your committee have had several matters under consideration and recommend as follows: That State street be repaved between the south line of Liberty st. and the street car track on Williams st. and the intersection on N. University ave. back to the brick pavement. This pavement to consist of 8 foot concrete gutters, six inches thick, on each side of the street and the space between paved with brick. We further recommend that the Board of Public Works prepare the necessary plans and specifications and submit them to the Council.

We also recommend that a crosswalk be constructed on the north side of Hill st. across Onondaga, and that the engineer prepare the necessary resolution for establishing a street grade on Onondaga st. between Hill st. and Geddes ave.

Owing to the lack of funds your committee is unwilling to recommend any work that does not appear to be absolutely necessary and for that reason some of the petitions referred to us have not been acted upon.

We further recommend that curb line and grade be given Mr. Purtell on Spring st. and for property owners on Oakland ave. between Tappan st. and Arch st. on south side and that the Street Commissioner do the necessary grading after curb is built. Ald. Heusel moved to amend that part of report relative to repaving S. State st. to read 4 in place of 8 foot concrete gutters.

Moved by Ald. Fiegel, that the matter of city taking gravel from Wurster property along Moseley st. be referred to Street committee and City Attorney for investigation. Adopted.

Sidewalk Grade.

By Ald. Prochnow: Whereas, in the opinion of the Council the grade of the sidewalk on the west side of Fifth ave. ought to be changed and fixed and established to the end that such street may be suitable for public travel, therefore

Resolved, and it is hereby ordered that the grade of the sidewalk on and along west side of Fifth ave. from the south line of Liberty st. to the north line of William st. be, and the same is hereby changed, fixed and established, so that the grade of said sidewalk on and along the street aforesaid shall be as follows, that is to say:

At the south line of Liberty st, 851.85. At the north line of William st. 854.13. B. M. on hydrant at Fifth ave. and Liberty st. 853.77. B. M. on hydrant at Fifth ave. and William st. 854.88, the elevation given being above the official city datum and along the center line of such walk, and the grade lines to consist of straight lines between the several points or stations above stated.

By Ald. Flynn: Resolved that at the general election to be held in the City of Ann Arbor on the third day of November, 1914, there be submitted to the duly qualified electors of the said city the question of raising by loan the sum of Twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000.00). Such funds when raised to be used for the purpose of equipping the Fire Department of said City of Ann Arbor Mich., with motor driven apparatus, and making such other improvements as is deemed necessary to guard against the occurrence of fires and to protect the property and the persons of the citizens against damage and accident resulting therefrom. Be it further resolved, that all of this is deemed and declared to be a necessary public improvement. Resolved, further that the

said election be held under the charter of the city and the laws of the State. Resolved, further, that the said election be held in the several wards of the City of Ann Arbor, Michigan, as follows: 1st ward, voting room basement City Hall; 2nd ward, ward building on S.
