First Proposition.

We propose to furnish service to post, equipped with 1 100-watt Mazda Tungsten lamp, to burn all night, every night, approximately 4,000 hrs, and 4 60-watt Mazda Tungsten lamps to burn until 10 p. m., each and every night, approximately 1,500 hours; to renew all lamps, as they burn out, and to wash and renew globes, for the sum of \$39.00 per post per annum.

Second Proposition.

We propose to furnish service to post, equipped with 1 60-watt Mazda burn all Tungsten lamp, to night, every night, approximately 4,000 hrs., 4 40-watt Mazda Tungsten and lamps, to burn until 10 p.m., each and every night, approximately 1,500 hrs.; to renew all lamps, and to wash and renew globes, for the sum of \$27.00 per post per annum.

These propositions to be covered by a contract signed by the company and the city of Ann Arbor for a periiod of five years, beginning with the commencement of service.
