Sept. 21, 1914. Regular session.

Meeting called to order by the president. Present: Ald. Fiegel, Heusel, A. Lutz, Hanselmann, Koernke, Prochnow, Markey, Hubbard, Sherk, Groves, Sink, G. Lutz, Pres. Schmid, 13. Absent: Ald. Flynn, McGregor, 2. Minutes of previous meeting approved.

Mr. Baird and Mr. Childs, representing those interested in the Soldiers' monument to be placed on the court house square, addressed the council, requesting co-operation in the making of big day of the date to be fixed for unveiling monument.
