Regular session. Meeting called to order by the president. Present: Ald. Fiegel, Heusel, A. Lutz, Hanselmann, Koernke, Prochnow, Flynn, Markey, Hubbard, Sherk, McGregor, Sink, G. Lutz, Pres. Schmid, 14. Absent: Ald. Groves, 1. Minutes of previous meeting approved.

### Communications.

(From Board of Public Works.)

Moved by Mr. Schmid, that the board recommends to the council that the plans and specifications covering asphaltic concrete for pavements on Jefferson and Division sts., as heretofore presented, be approved.

(Council action).

By Ald. Fiegel, resolved, that the plans, specifications and estimates of cost of paving Division st. from Detroit to Packard sts. and Jefferson st. from Fifth ave. to State st. with asphaltic concrete, as presented by the board of public works, be approved; and the board of public works instructed to proceed with the paving of said streets according to the charter and ordinances governing the same.

Resolved, further, that the construction of such pavements is deemed and declared to be a necessary public improvement.

Moved by Ald. Markey, that it be referred to the Street committee, which was adopted by unanimous vote of those present, 14.

Of Geo. E. Apfel, et al, requesting that the proposition of appropriating the sum of \$600.00, to be used for the purpose of giving a series of ten band concerts on the court house square during the summer months, be submitted to the people at the Spring election.

Moved by Ald. Markey, that petition and matter of fire protection around churches and matter of water main on Hiscock st. between Spring and Summit sts. be referred to water committee. Adopted.
