

Council Chamber, Ann Arbor, Mich., August 2nd, 1915. Regular Session.

Meeting called to order by the President. Present: Ald. Fiegel, Hanselmann, Koernke, Heck, Markey, Flynn, Sherk, McGregor, Freeman, G. Lutz, Sink and Pres. Wurster, 12. Absent: Ald. Heusel, A. Lutz and Manwaring, 3. Minutes of previous meeting approved.

Communications.

From Board of Public Works—

Bids on pavement of Geddes avenue between Oswego street and Oxford road received as follows: The Good Roads Construction Co., Chicago, Ill., \$5,440.00. Barnes & O'Neil, Allegan, Mich., \$4,691.00. Moved by Mr. Schmid, that in as much as Barnes & O'Neil are lowest bidders, this board recommends to the council that the proposal be accepted, and they be awarded the contract. Adopted by the board.

Sewer Committee.

To the Council: Gentlemen—Your sewer committee have had the following matters under consideration, and recommend that the petition for sanitary sewers on all the streets in the Hamilton, Rose and Sheehan addition be granted, with the understanding that an outlet be constructed from Hamilton, Rose and Sheehan addition to Edwin street and included in the City portion of the cost of said sanitary sewers. We further recommend that a sanitary sewer be constructed on West Main street, from Main street west about twenty rods. Your committee also recommends that a storm-water sewer be built on Geddes avenue, from Linden street to Boulevard. The City Engineer to furnish plans, specifications and estimate of the cost of above named sanitary sewers and present the same to the council with all convenient dispatch. To the Council: Gentlemen—Your Police committee respectfully recommend that the ordinance committee present to the council as soon as is possible, an amendment to the traffic ordinance establishing safety zones in the congested districts as follows: Corner Main and Huron, Washington and Liberty, William and State, North University and State street, and such other parts of the city as the Council may from time to time designate by resolution.

Your committee further recommend that the ordinance be so amended that it thoroughly covers vehicle lights and dimmers.

That the tungston light on the corner of Fifth avenue and Liberty street be moved 200 feet east on the south side of Liberty street. That two tungston street lights be placed on the south side of East Washington street, one about 100 feet and the other about 250 feet east of Fifth avenue, and also one on the south west corner of East University avenue and Willard street.
