#### From Water Works Dept.

September 15, 1915.

To the Honorable Common Council of the city of Ann Arbor: Gentlemen—This department wishes to submit the following information in regard to laying of mains in 1914 and 1915, and cost of same to date, thinking the information might be of interest to you.

Following extensions were made in 1914—

4440 ft. of 12 in. pipe on Church, Hill, S. Univ. and S. State st.

1344 ft. of 10 in. pipe on Chapin st., from Washington to Miller ave.

835 ft. of 6 in. pipe on Church, from Oakland to Prospect.

743 ft. of 6 in. pipe on Church, from S. Univ to College.

75 ft. of 6 in. pipe on Church, from Willard to S. Univ.

438 ft. of 6 in. pipe on W. Liberty st.

410 ft. of 6 in. pipe on Murray addition.

365 ft. of 2 in. pipe on Sauer addition.

614 ft. of 6 in. pipe on Eighth, between Liberty and Washington.

320 ft. of 4 in. pipe on Brookwood Place.

587 ft. of 6 in. pipe on Granger ave., from Packard to Olivia.

735 ft. of 6 in. pipe on N. Fourth ave., from Beakes to Summit.

312 ft. of 6 in. pipe on Bath st.

963 ft. of 6 in. pipe on W. Washington st.

249 ft. of 6 in. pipe on Crest ave. south of W. Washington st.

687 ft. of 6 in. pipe on N. Fifth, from hydrant on Beakes.

440 ft. of 1 1-2 in. pipe on Packard and Tappan streets.

648 ft. of 1 in. pipe at various places where larger pipe could not be laid on account of small pipe to connect to.

At a cost of \$15,488.15.

308 new taps at a cost of \$3,310.51.

On Church street, where paving was contemplated, a new main was laid, and all consumers were disconnected from the old 1 1-2 and 2 in. mains, and connected to new 6 in. main, without cost to consumers, but at a loss of time and material to this department. There were three blocks of such work, with consumers on each side of the street. This work on service connections makes our tap expense heavy.

This year to date we have made the following extensions—

554 ft. of 6 in. pipe on McKinley ave., from Packard to White.

777 ft. of 6 in. pipe on White st., from Arch to Dewey ave.

333 ft. of 6 in. pipe on E. Jefferson, from State to Maynard.

584 ft. of 6 in. pipe on E. Jefferson, from Thompson to Hamilton Place.

383 ft. of 6 in. pipe on Eighth, from W. Washington south.

927 ft. of 6 in. pipe on Division, from Hill to Packard.

675 ft. of 6 in. pipe on W. Ann, from Main to First st.

1052 ft. of 6 in. pipe on Division, from Liberty to Ann st.

436 ft. of 6 in. pipe on Olivia, from Wells to Minerva road.

448 ft. of 6 in. pipe on First, from Madison to Moseley st.

124 ft. of 6 in. pipe on White, from Arch.

36 ft. of 6 in. pipe on Sixth st. extension.

525 ft. of 6 in. pipe on Crest ave. south of Washington.

78 ft. of 2 in. pipe on Sauer addition.

117 ft. of 11-4 in. pipe on First, from Miller ave. toward Ann st.

100 ft. of 11-2 in. pipe on Second st. to flush tank between Liberty and Williams st.

At a cost of \$5,619.09.

238 new taps at an expense of \$2,-586.54.

This includes disconnecting from old 11-2 in. main to new 6 in. mains as follows:

2 blocks on W. Ann st.

3 block on Division st.

3 blocks on Jefferson st., which makes the tap account heavy, as connections so made are without cost to consumer.

On account of paving Ann, Division and Jefferson streets, old mains had to be removed and larger ones laid, delaying, of course, work on other streets needing water mains, until this work was completed.

Construction at Station 1 to the amount of \$4,965.00, includes a new 31-2 million gallons, electrically driven, centrifugal pump; chlorine plant to treat the water; 16 in. main leading part way from Barton pond to station, emergency vacuum pump, old one worn out and new one replaced, which will make a great saving in coal; reshingling of buildings in progress, as well as painting same.

Construction work is being rushed as fast as possible. The inclement weather has greatly delayed the progress of laying mains but we intend to continue construction work as late as possible.

A report has reached this Department that more water was pumped this summer than last. To correct this error we herewith submit the monthly pumping record for the five summer months of 1914 and 1915:

**City Attorney's Report.**

Ann Arbor, Mich., September 20th, 1915.

To the Honorable the Common Council: Gentlemen—At your meeting held on September 7th, last, I was asked through your Committee on Railways for an opinion relative to the authority of the Common Council to pass an ordinance to prohibit the so-called smoke nuisance.

I have given the matter considerable attention and I have arrived at the same conclusion reached by my predecessors in office, that is, that the provision of our charter is not broad enough to cover the matter.

In the absence of a statutory provision, or a charter provision, a municipal corporation is without power to declare by ordinance the issuance of dense smoke within certain limits for a specified period to be a nuisance per se.

Glucose Refining Co. vs. Chicago, 138 Fed. 209.

It would appear from the decision of the Supreme Court of our own state in the recent case of the People vs. Detroit, Bell Isle, Etc. Ferry Co. reported on page 668 D. L. N. Vol. 22 that the authority to pass such an ordinance must be clearly delegated to the municipality and the regulations must be reasonable.

I am of the opinion that such an ordinance cannot be enacted at the present time.
