this work was completed.

1 to the Construction at Staticn amount of \$4,965.00, includes a new million gallons, electrically driven, centrifugal pump; chlorine plant to treat the water; 16 in. main leading part way from Barton pond to station, emergency vacuum pump, old one worn out and new one replaced, which will make a great saving in coal; reshingling of buildings in progress, as well as painting same.

Construction work is being rushed as fast as possible. The inclement weather has greatly delayed the progress of laying mains but we intend to continue construction work

as late as possible.

A report has reached this department that more water was pumped this summer than last. To correct this error we herewith submit the monthly pumping record for the five summer months of 1914 and 1915:

### City Attorney's Report.

Ann Arbor, Mich., September 20th, 1915.

To the Honorable the Common Council: Gentlemen—At your meeting held on September 7th, last, I was asked through your Committee on Railways for an opinion relative to the authority of the Common Council to pass an ordinance to prohibit the so-called smoke nuisance.

I have given the matter considerable attention and I have arrived at the same conclusion reached by my predecessors in office, that is, that the provision of our charter is not broad enough to cover the matter.

In the absence of a statutory provision, or a charter provision, a municipal corporation is without power to declare by ordinance the issuance of dense smoke within certain limits for a specified period to be a nuisance per se.

Glucose Refining Co. vs. Chicago, 138 Fed. 209.

It would appear from the decision of the Supreme Court of our own state in the recent case of the People vs. Detroit, Bell Isle, Etc. Ferry Co. reported on page 668 D. L. N. Vol. 22 that the authority to pass such an ordinance must be clearly delegated to the municipality and the regulations must be reasonable.

I am of the opinion that such an ordinance cannot be enacted at the present time.
