**Sewer Committee Report.**

To the Honorable, the Common Council: Gentlemen—Your Sewer committee has had the following matters under consideration, and respectfully recommend that sanitary sewers be constructed as follows: On Hill st., from the former city limits to Berkshire road; on Berkshire road, from Hill st. south to the present city limits; on Onondaga st., from Hill st.

to Geddes ave., and on Geddes ave., from Onondaga st. to the east end of the present sewer. Also on Wells st., from Baldwin ave. to Ferdon road.

Your committee further recommends that the City Clerk be instructed to draw warrant in favor of the City Treasurer for \$7.50, for sewer assessment on the south 10 ft. of the south 80 ft. lot B, of block 4 S., R. 4 and 5 west, Wm. S. Maynard's third add., said assessment being in District No. 64.

Your committee further recommends that Dr. R. G. MacKenzie be permitted to connect his home on West Liberty st. with the city sewer, upon payment of fifty dollars per year to the City Treasurer.
