#### From Board of Public Works.

Mr. Thompson, representative of  
Kelly-Springfield, made oral proposi-  
tion as follows: Will ship at once the  
Kelly-Springfield gasoline two-cylin-  
der ten-ton roller, with scarifier, to  
be rented by city until July 1, 1918, at  
rental of \$1,600.00, allowing \$600.00  
for old roller, and \$1,000.00 to be paid  
in 30 days. At expiration of rental  
period city can purchase for \$3,-  
950.00, deducting rental \$1,600.00  
leaving balance of \$2,350.00.

Mr. W. Cornwell presented the fol-  
lowing proposition:

Ann Arbor, Mich., Sept. 12th, 1917.

Proposition: On behalf of the Aus-  
tin Western Road Machinery Co., of  
Chicago, Ill., I am pleased to offer  
herewith my proposal for furnishing  
the City of Ann Arbor, Michigan, with  
one of our rollers complete, with  
scarifier attached, and with all tools  
and attachments regularly furnished  
with said machine—subject to the  
terms and conditions hereafter named.

We will ship at once one—ten ton  
Austin single cylinder motor roller,  
with pneumatic scarifier, as illustrated  
and described, complete in every de-  
tail, and in accordance with the spec-  
ifications submitted with our formal  
bid—will pay the freight, and on its  
arrival here will furnish a competent  
operator to unload and put it to work  
on your streets, under the direction of  
your Engineer or other proper official.  
You on your part agree to furnish a  
man who is to run the machine, and  
also such assistance and fuel as may  
be necessary in the actual unloading  
and running, and our expert will re-  
main here to teach your operator the  
care and operation of the machine  
(such instruction to be without ex-  
pense to the city) until such time as  
you are thoroughly satisfied that the  
roller is according to our guarantees,  
and is formally accepted by you.

Providing the machine is in accord-  
ance with our guarantees and capable  
of doing the work for which it is in-  
tended, in an efficient and thorough  
manner, you agree to accept it for a  
rental period ending July 1st, 1918,  
and agree to pay as rent for this per-

iod the sum of four hundred dollars  
(\$400.00) in cash on Dec. 1st 1917, and  
four hundred dollars (\$400.00) in  
cash on May 1st, 1918, and to deliver  
the machine F. O. B. cars immediately  
upon expiration of the rental period.

In the event, however, of your de-  
ciding to purchase the machine at any  
time from now on to that date, viz.,  
July 1st, 1918, we agree to allow the  
above amount paid as rental to apply  
on the purchase price as bid formally  
to you, viz., \$3000.00 and your old  
roller, together with interest at 6  
percent on the deferred amount from  
date of acceptance to date of pur-  
chase.

But should you find the machine  
not up to our representations and un-  
able to accomplish its tasks in the  
amount described, then we will re-  
load the machine and return it to the  
factory without any additional ex-  
pense or obligation on your part.

Whereas, said committee has taken the matter up with the present contractor, and have received an offer from said contractor to dispose of said garbage until such time as Mr. Wagoner starts collecting under his contract, for the sum of \$28.00 per day, six days per week now therefore be it

Resolved, that the Mayor and City Clerk execute a contract with Mr. Edward Besch for the disposal of said garbage for the term above provided, when said contract is approved by the City Attorney.
