I have felt for some time that in view
of the compensation paid to the hold-
er of the office of City Treasurer,
which compensation is limited by the
provisions of our charter to the sum
of \$100.00 a month, and \$100.00 a

Moved by Mr. Rentschler, that con-
cerning recommendation from Coun-
cil in matter of repairs to fire station
No. 1, the Board respectfully reports
that they have made a personal in-
vestigation, and would recommend
that in place of repairs suggested a

general change be made by tearing out the partition walls and putting in steel columns and "I" beams, to make entire first floor one room. The Board feels that with present motor driven equipment this would be a necessary improvement, and that the money would be more judiciously spent by making such a general change than by the temporary improvements recommended. Adopted by Board.

City Engineer presented plans and specifications in accordance with above recommendation.

Sealed proposals were received as follows: C. H. Kittreage, wiring fire station No. 1 for electric lights as per plans and specifications, \$300.00; A. R. Cole Co., to furnish and erect steel columns and "I" beams, furnish new door and frame, and install same at the rear of the present middle room on the main apparatus floor, all according to the plans, for \$1,685.00, does not include the tearing down of brick walls, encasing of "I" beams, electric wiring or heating and plumbing. H. J. Hochrein, \$1,998.00, complete, according to plans and specifications.

Moved by Mr. Arnet, that if the Council see its way clear to install the work according to plans and specifications presented by City Engineer, the Board recommends that contract be awarded to Mr. H. J. Hochrein. Adopted by Board. (Council action)

From Park Superintendent.

November 5, 1917.

To the Common Council: Owing to the fact that the Whitmore Lake road grade separation bridge will not be completed this fall, the heavy traffic all winter from that point to the city will necessarily be over Long Shore drive along the river. With the appropriation of \$150.00 which was allowed the Park Commission last spring, for road improvements, the road was greatly improved; however, not sufficiently so for the heavy traffic which will come through the winter.

At the suggestion of Mr. Markey, chairman of your Park committee, Mr. Underdown of the Huron Farms Co., has consented to give \$200 toward putting this road in good con-

dition providing the city will give a like amount.

In consideration of this generous offer from the Huron Farms Co., the Park Commission through its Superintendent hereby asks the Common Council for a special appropriation of \$200 to properly build up this road. Respectfully submitted, Ray E. Bassett, Superintendent of Parks.
