To the Honorable Common Council: Sirs—In connection with the building of the bridge over the Huron river on Broadway, that part of Pontiac st., between Swift st. and Moore st., is being widened and graded, the dirt being used for the fill over the bridge. The Fifth Ward voting place stands at the Swift st. entrance to this part of Pontiac st. I would recommend, if you think it advisable, that this be moved to some other location nearby in order that this street may be properly graded for its full width and length.
