By Ald Lutz: Whereas, the Common Council met, Nov. 6, 1918, as Committee of Whole, and agreed upon the following schedule of compensation for certain city employes, therefore

Resolved, that beginning Nov. 1, 1918, the compensation per month of employes of the city, hereinafter mentioned, shall be fixed as follows:

Chief of Fire Dept. and Acting Marshal of Police Dept., each \$133.32; Asst. Chief and Engineer of Fire Dept., each \$112.76; two Captains of Fire

Dept., each \$106.96; two Watchmen of Fire Dept., each \$67.38; second year firemen and policemen, each \$102.46; first year firemen and policemen, each \$95.10; Sanitary policemen, \$102.46; Sexton Fairview Cemetery, \$70.00.

Resolved, further, that the compensation of the city employees, above mentioned, shall not be raised for the period of one year from Nov. 1st, 1918.
