From Board of Public Works.

Moved by Mr. Cole, that Board recommends to Council that Letchfield & Stewart, being the lowest bidders, be awarded the contracts for construction of asphaltic concrete pavements, Mexican asphalt, on South and East University avenues, with concrete curb and gutter.

The Board then took up the matter of the recommendation of the Common Council relative to use of a concrete curb on Fourth ave., Detroit st., and Catherine st.; on Detroit st. and on Broadway, and after a lengthy discussion of the relative merits of stone and concrete curb, Mr. Rentschler offered the following resolution:

Whereas, the following streets: Fourth ave., Detroit st., and Catherine st.; Detroit st. and Broadway are in the so-called business districts of the city, and

Whereas, the city is to pay over 50 percent of the cost of the pavement on Detroit st., and

Whereas, the city must replace the curb at the expense of the general taxpayer after a curb is once constructed,

Resolved, that the Board renew its recommendation of June 12, 1919, awarding contract for the construction of the pavements on Fourth ave., Detroit st. and Catherine st.; on Detroit st. and on Broadway to W. J. Clancy, for brick pavements, using Townsend block, wire cut lug, and stone curb; since the life of a stone curb is much longer than a cement curb, the Board deems it advisable to use a stone curb.
