Ann Arbor, Mich., Oct. 8, 1919.

Sewer Committee Report

To the Honorable, the Common Council, Gentlemen: Your Sewer Committee, to whom was referred the estimate and report of the City Engineer, relative to the construction of lateral sewer in sewer district No. 94, on State Street, from north line of Hamilton, Rose & Sheehan addition to Boulevard drive and on Boulevard drive from State st., west 750 feet, begs leave to report that we have had such estimate and report, as well as resolution of Council, under consideration, and have made due inquiries relating thereto, and have heard all persons desiring to be heard in the premises; and your committee is of the opinion that there is necessity for the construction of such lateral sewer in said district, and that special taxing or assessment district ought to be fixed by the Common Council upon and against which the construction of such sewer may be charged, street intersections excepted, pursuant to the ordinance in such case made and provided.

Your committee further recommends that resolutions fixing the

boundaries of said district be prepared by the City Engineer and the Board of Public Works be ordered to advertise for bids for the construction of above named sewer.

Resolved, further, that the City Engineer furnish proper boundary as soon as possible and that this order and determination be certified to the City Assessor and the Board of Public Works, and the Board of Public Works advertise for bids for the construction of said sewer, city to furnish men to see that sewer pipe is properly laid.

Hoad & Decker be employed at approximate cost of \$4,200.00 to make all necessary surveys and field investigations and to work out a comprehensive plan for system of sanitary sewers with view of ultimate disposal plant; and that the Mayor and City Clerk be and are hereby authorized to enter into contract with Messrs. Hoad & Decker when contract has been approved by City Attorney.
